

## **Corrog Wood**

Deer Park Rd, Portaferry

12 000 native trees were planted in 2000, you can find Oak, Rowan, Scots Pine, Hazel and they have a discovery trail to find them.



A Dryad (Tree Nymph) found at the entrance will protect the forest according to Greek Mythology.

The 0.2km path is easy bringing you around a small pond. The 0.6km & 0.7km trails have a short steep hill with some rough paths. The trails overlap so all can be achieved in 1.2 km.





Short walks means time to make den, so pack some tarps.

Leave no trace careful not to break branches and don't leave anything behind.

A nice stop if going for a drive along the Ards Peninsula, maybe heading to Portaferry or cloughey beach for an ice-cream or coffee.
